Really, I'm sure Princess will be able to adjust herself to life in camp and I'd be just awfully happy to have her again, so please do not hesitate to send her to me if she is troubling you at all.

- Thank you ever so much for doctoring that infection on her chin, Mrs. Whitney. I hope Princess appreciates the fine care you're giving her as much as I do.

Our air cooler came yesterday and this morning Papa and a friend are installing it. I can hardly wait until they finish. It will be so much nicer - I have heat rash all over my back and neck as does everyone else. A lot of

- add to that the insect bites, and you  
have mighty uncomfortable people:

at the end of the month we are  
going to have a circus and one of my  
students is going to dance. She has  
had acrobatics before and is very  
good. I've made up and have  
taught her an acrobatic - waltz

with the circus there is going to
