You can't imagine how thrilled I was to have Sue walk in & say, "the Shaji girl stopped her," & Mrs. Krebil stepped out & said you had sent it down with her. Candy is so rare here in Poston we appreciated it more so. Fortunately, the Waters came over this evening & we gave them a box too. They all send their thanks & regards to you & Mr. Whitney.

Yesterday, Miss Harris came over for a short visit. She is the lady who worked among the Japanese people in Upland for the Free Methodist church. She isn't a very intimate friend of ours, but I thought I was nice of her to stop in & say hello. Aside from hearing about them, I do not know any of the people who came in to visit the Shaji Okamatas today. To say the least, I think it is just too nice to be remembered.

It hasn't been quite as cold as it was Friday morning. Yesterday, it was 34° at 7 A.M. - this morning 39°. There was a lot of frost on the ground this morning, especially

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did we notice it as we walked to Mass.
Goodness, I almost thought my toes would
snap off any minute - but I really don't
mind the 1 1/2 mile round trip to Mass at
all - Father Clement is such a kind
Father, and I look forward to seeing him.
Oh yes, this morning, Father Clement said
another Father was going to Kela, so in a
few weeks, he'd be able to devote all his
time here. I'm actually thrilled to death to
hear this as we've all taken a great liking
to Father. (Father is building a place in Parker)

here at Poston get permanents at cost price
which amounts to \$1.50 - (they are Quartz
waves too) yes - there are some disadvantages
in being in a place such as we are now
in - but the majority of us are far better
off.

"million thanks" to you - for the Card,
and their regards to Mr. Whitney, Elmer
Braddo.
