



# WRA DIRECTOR MYER VISITS

## STATES CTRS. TO STAY OPEN 'TIL JAN. 1, 1946

All relocation centers now operating will be opened until Jan. 1, 1946, according to present WRA plans, Dillon S. Myer, national director of WRA, announced yesterday. Rohwer Center, as well as other centers, with the exception of a segregation camp, will

be closed on Jan. 1, 1946, change in plans excepted. In all cases, three-month notice of closing of the Center will be given, Myer assured the residents. Any evacuees who cannot take care of themselves when on their own will be treated as individual cases

according to need, assistance to be given through various welfare agencies or the Social Security Board.

Myer arrived at Rohwer Monday night and will stay until tomorrow, during which time he will hold conferences with the appointed personnel, the Community Council and Block Managers and individual residents. He will address the Rohwer public tonight at a mass meeting in the Auditorium at 7:30. With Rohwer as the starting point, he plans to visit all the relocation centers by Mar. 30, to learn firsthand the Center problems and help with their solutions, and to meet personally the appointed staffs and the evacuee residents.

Enthusiastically confident of the situation in California, which he said was excellent, Myer gave his firsthand views of the West Coast, picked up from his 10-day trip, Jan. 2-13, from Seattle, Wash., via Portland, Ore., San Francisco, Cal., to Los Angeles, Cal.

"The situation in California is excellent for the evacuees, better than it has ever been before. The evacuees are receiving special attention, from the governor down. An important factor is that the return of evacuees to the West Coast has become a national question and is no longer a local problem. All eyes are focussed on California, Oregon and Washington, for 35,000 persons of Japanese descent,

## Wells Mishap Investigated

The following is based on report made by Joe Grant Masaoka representing the JAEL in an impartial investigation of the recent Wells, Nevada, shooting incident.

Three Japanese kitchen workers were shot in the Wells cafe-hotel operated for the past seven months by Karl Nakamura, several hours after Harry Gomi, 59 year-old Issei cook, refused to cash a personal check or to lend J.M. Monroe \$20. Monroe a brakeman on the Union Pacific freight and passenger line, shot Gomi, Kyutaro Frank Fujinami, and Ken Seichi Kikumoto on Jan. 20 at 6 p.m. They were taken to the Elko General Hospital and their condition was im-

(Continued from page 1) Murphy of Wells scoffed at newspaper reports of Monroe's claim to amnesia by showing Masaoka Monroe's tracks in the snow and explaining he had made too clever an attempt to conceal his tracks and then boarded his outbound freight train leaving on scheduled time with his regular crew.

According to Masaoka, Sheriff C. Smith of the Elko County seat where Monroe is now lodged declared that he was going to prosecute Monroe with "Assault and intent to kill" and demand the full penalty of the law. The prisoner waived preliminary hearings and will be held for jury trial in the District Court, sometime in May, according to the sheriff. Conviction carries a penalty of from 12 to 20 years.

(Continued from page 1) emissaries of good-will, have relocated to all parts of the nation and 13,000 Nisei are in the United States armed forces," Myer said.

Allowing that unfortunate "incidents" may occur, he said that they will be the exception rather than the rule, prompted by private economic interests. These troubles are bluffs. The majority of the West Coast population has accepted the military decision and accord good reception to fellow law-abiding people. Governor Earl Warren of California is all out to help the returning evacuees, and has asked the cooperation of officials and deputy sheriffs throughout the state to maintain law and order. Mayor Fletcher Bowron of Los Angeles has contacted police officials and school leaders to prepare the way for the evacuees. Jobs in all fields are being contacted for returnees.

### Status of Discharged Soldiers and Paroled Aliens

Although the policy on visits has been broadened to include soldiers on furlough and those awaiting assignment to active duty men who have been discharged from the Army on medical grounds or for other reasons are in the same status, with regard to center visits, as relocatees.

The same principal applies to aliens who have been paroled from internment camps. We are now notifying the Justice Department that we can no longer induct parolees as center residents and that sponsorship should hereafter be arranged for them before they leave the internment camps. Parolees may of course be admitted to the centers as temporary visitors provided they meet the necessary requirements.

## BAGGAGE REGULATIONS RELEASED

Since no bonded officer of WPA is responsible for the safety of baggage, the service of picking up and checking baggage for those who are relocating, provided by the transpor-

tation unit of the Relocation division is a service only.

Residents are entitled to check without charge a maximum of 150 pounds for each full fare traveler and 75 pounds for each half fare traveler.

Baggage must be on the road at the end of the barrack not later than 1 p.m. on the date of pickup. Baggage checks will be given with the tickets.

In order to avoid errors in checking, the number of pieces to be picked up must be stated on the given forms. If more or fewer than the stated number are present, None will be picked up, the transportation unit reported.

Priority for riding the relocation truck will be given in the following order: Terminal leave (indefinite leave), short term, soldiers, visitors.

Those with day passes have no priority.
