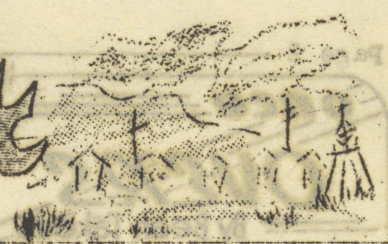

## Change in Rules for Visiting G.I.s

Nisei servicemen who expect to furlough in the Center will no longer be required to have the advance approval of the Relocation officer, according to WRA Director Dillon Myer.

The soldiers, however, will have to pay the usual visitor's guest charges during the period visited.

## CTR. SERVICEMEN AWARDED BADGES

Among 183 Japanese American servicemen from the various WRA centers awarded the Combat Infantryman's Badges for exemplary conduct under enemy fire, were 21 formerly of Rohwer.

All are members of the 442nd Combat Team having joined it as reinforcements prior to its departure for

Southern France. They earned their awards in the bitter fighting in the Vosges Mountains of Eastern France with the 7th Army. They participated in the historic breakthrough of the main German lines of resistance in this sector and in the dramatic rescue of the now famous Lost Battalion of this war in the wooded ridges near Bruyeres, France.

## POST EXCLUSION BUL. NO. 5

Part 1 of Post-exclusion Bulletin No. 5 follows  
MORE ON EAST AND SOUTH

Since we have been notified by the War Department that the eastern and southern restrictions have been rescinded, there no longer seems to be any reason why excludees should not relocate immediately in those areas if they choose. The note in Bulletin 4 indicating that they should await official notification from the Western Defense Command may hereafter be disregarded.

### CLARIFICATION OF SEASONAL LEAVE POLICY

The following excerpt from a recent letter signed by the Director should help to clear up some of the questions that have been raised regarding the seasonal leave policy:

The policy of the War Relocation Authority in regard to the recruitment of agricultural workers for 1945 is as follows:

"(1) The seasonal leave program through which evacuee residents of relocation Centers have been available for temporary agricultural employment in the past has been terminated.

"(2) Agricultural workers in the Centers will receive every encouragement to resettle in agricultural areas where there is adequate opportunity for them as agricultural workers or

for share-crop lease or other farm deals as they may wish. This will, of course, be contingent upon there being housing facilities available for family living.

"(3) Although evacuees are free to make their own choice as to when they will leave the centers and where they may wish to go, recruitment for clearly seasonal work from which the evacuee may expect to return to the centers will be discouraged and the evacuee will be advised that he is ineligible to return to the Center from such employment the same as if he were accepting other permanent employment.

The reasons for this policy are obvious. With the lifting of the exclusion order restoring freedom of movement to the evacuees, which became effective on January 3, the WRA established as its major objective the closing all centers by December 31, 1945. This means that we will have to assist approximately 60,000 people to relocate during the next eleven months. Seasonal employment such as has existed in the past would prove a serious block to meeting such a goal inasmuch as all thoughts and acts of the evacuees should be centered on permanent relocation at this time.

A little more than two years ago, in November of 1942, when Dillon Myer first visited Rohwer, he spoke to the members of the Temporary Community Council, which was then setting up the groundwork for the present Council body.

I was there, as I was the secretary of the temporary group, and we all listened to Myer's talk with expectant interest. None of us knew much about the man. He had been assistant administrator of the Soil Conservation Service in the Department of Agriculture. And when Milton Eisenhower, brother of General Ike, resigned as WRA director to take a job with the OWI, Myer succeeded him.

But aside from that, we knew little or nothing about Dillon Myer. So we listened to his talk to try to learn something about the man. We were disappointed, though. He didn't talk about himself. He didn't say much about what he was going to do or try to do.

He frankly admitted that the purpose of his visit was to become acquainted with us, to know the conditions under which we had to live, and to learn firsthand some of the problems that would have to be solved by his agency. He didn't make any promises, and he didn't outline any program.

But we did come away from that meeting with two definite impressions of the man. We all agreed that he was a very charming man. He had won us over completely with his charm and personality. But more important, we agreed that he was a sincere man. We felt that if sincerity counted for anything, Dillon Myer would make us a good director.

I recalled that last week, when Myer came to visit us, and I felt an inward satisfaction, for Dillon Myer had made us a good director. Sure, he has

(continued from page 2) made mistakes, and perhaps we have not all agreed wholeheartedly with some of the policies of the WRA.

But certainly, taken as a whole, Myer has done a remarkable job. We can thank our lucky stars that a man of Myer's integrity and caliber was in charge during those early, uncertain months of the relocation centers and especially during the tumultuous months that followed the Tulalake disturbance in November of 1943.

The man believed in us, and his faith never wavered, even during the darkest days of his administration. How else can you explain the manner in which he stood up for us and the WRA against the so-called investigations that were conducted in Washington, especially the Dies probe, which was nothing more than a smear campaign pure and simple.

Sugimoto has a most creditable collection of oils and watercolors done at Rohwer and Jerome. The Center paintings depict true everyday life since evacuation. He will also show a group of watercolors done in France.

Sugimoto, a private art instructor prior to evacuation, is now Rohwer high school art instructor. He lives in Block 29 with his family, Mrs. Sugimoto and daughter Sumile.

politician had been in Myer's place. Dillon Myer is not a politician, in the popular sense of the word. He is an administrator, and an able one. And he is a friend, and an honest one.

Some people were disappointed that Myer, in his talks here, did not promise compensation for losses sustained in the evacuation. But we must remember that the WRA did not

evacuate us. The Army did. I think all of us owe Dillon Myer a grateful vote of thanks. Not because he has not made any mistakes. Not because we have necessarily agreed with everything the WRA has done.

But because he has taken a difficult, thankless job and done an amazingly efficient piece of work in the face of all sorts of bigotry, misunderstanding, and ignorance.

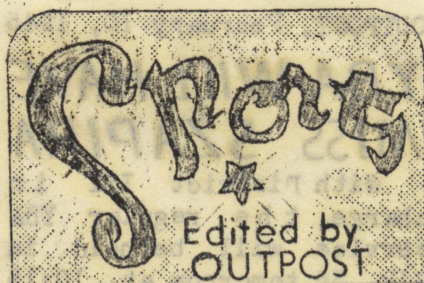

## Rules and Regulations

During the Basketball games, absolutely no smoking will be allowed. In case of failure to cooperate promptly on the parts of either fans or participants, the Auditorium committee, ISP, Fire Department or Basketball Committee will ask the managers of teams on the court as well as referee on the floor to stop the game immediately. Games will resume immediately after such request is complied with on the part of "fans" and participants. If not, complete cancellation of game will follow.

Same rules as above-rule No. 1, will apply to the following:

- a. Unnecessary roughness and rowdyism within the auditorium
- b. Abuse in usage of any auditorium facilities and equipments
- c. Failure on part of fans or participants to cooperate with those in charge of building.

## LEAGUE RULES

1. In case of dispute in game, final decisions will be made on two-third vote of Basketball Committee.
2. All games to be played under National Inter-Collegiate Rules.
3. Referees - One referee each to be furnished by team on floor.
4. No player limit with following rules:
  - a. All individual players on team must be registered with CA Athletic Office, PS hall 27.
  5. Transfer of player could be made with approval of Basketball Committee.
  6. Eligible for league

participation - All players must register at the Athletic Office, PS hall 27, seven days before league game.

7. Schedule of time and allowance:

a. Girls game - 1 hour maximum each game.

b. Boys game - 1 hour 30 min. maximum each game.

8. Playing time and time out:

a. 10 minutes - playing time.

b. 1 minute - between quarter.

c. 10 minutes - between half.

9. All league rules subject to change with the approval of the two-thirds vote of Basketball Committee.

10. During the basketball game, complete authority on interpretation and decision will rest with the referees on the floor. Abuse of referee by any individual players on the team will not be tolerated. Breaking of this rule will be complete disbarment of such players from participation in all league games.

11. All protest or dispute arising from games should be registered with Basketball Committee by the managers of team involved.

CA Athletic Department will coordinate following activities with the league Basketball Committee.

- a. Publicity
- b. Auditorium scheduling.
- c. Furnish score-keeper.
- d. Furnish timekeeper.
- e. Act as general secretary to chairman.
- f. Set up playing schedule.
- g. Will notify teams and departments on general activities.
