# Manzanar High School History

In spite of obstacles in the form of teacher-shortage and the lack of essential facilities, Manzanar High School was officially opened on October 7, 1942, when an assembly was held at the Out-door Theater on the southwest corner of camp for all of the prospective high school students. The assembly was comprised of those with feelings of apprehension; those with mixed sensations of excitement and gladness; and others who were sadly resigned to more school work and yet, on the whole, the majority were thankful that the idle days of inactivity were over.

Of course, when regular school work began, problems of student cooperation, and crowded, ill-equipped classes faced the school administration.

The class rooms were very bare and cold. There were no heaters

during those cold winter days; the walls were bare and the cold wind and dust shoved their way through the cracks in the walls and floors. At that time there were no chairs, so the students had to sit on the cold uncomfortable floors.

Discipline was slack, but as the days went by, the students began to adjust themselves to the new routine and to settle down to a more normal attitude toward studying. During the first semester, there was not enough time to plan any extra-curricular activities, but the first graduating class made the most of what was available. March 7, 1943, is memorable as the date of the first Manzanar graduation.

It was the first steps that were the hardest. In inaugurating this second semester the advantages of experience and experiments have made the "going" smoother, and the arrival of chairs, books, and other long-anticipated supplies improved the morale and the scholastic standard of the school.

Having had their Outing Day, Sweater Day, Senior Dance, Senior Prom, and Banquet, the Seniors are anxiously awaiting that long anticipated day, July 3, 1943, when they will receive their diplomas with great pride.

The Seniors can graduate with a sense of accomplishment, for they are leaving behind, traditions for the coming senior classes to carry on. Manzanar may be well satisfied with the progress its high school has made in two semesters.
