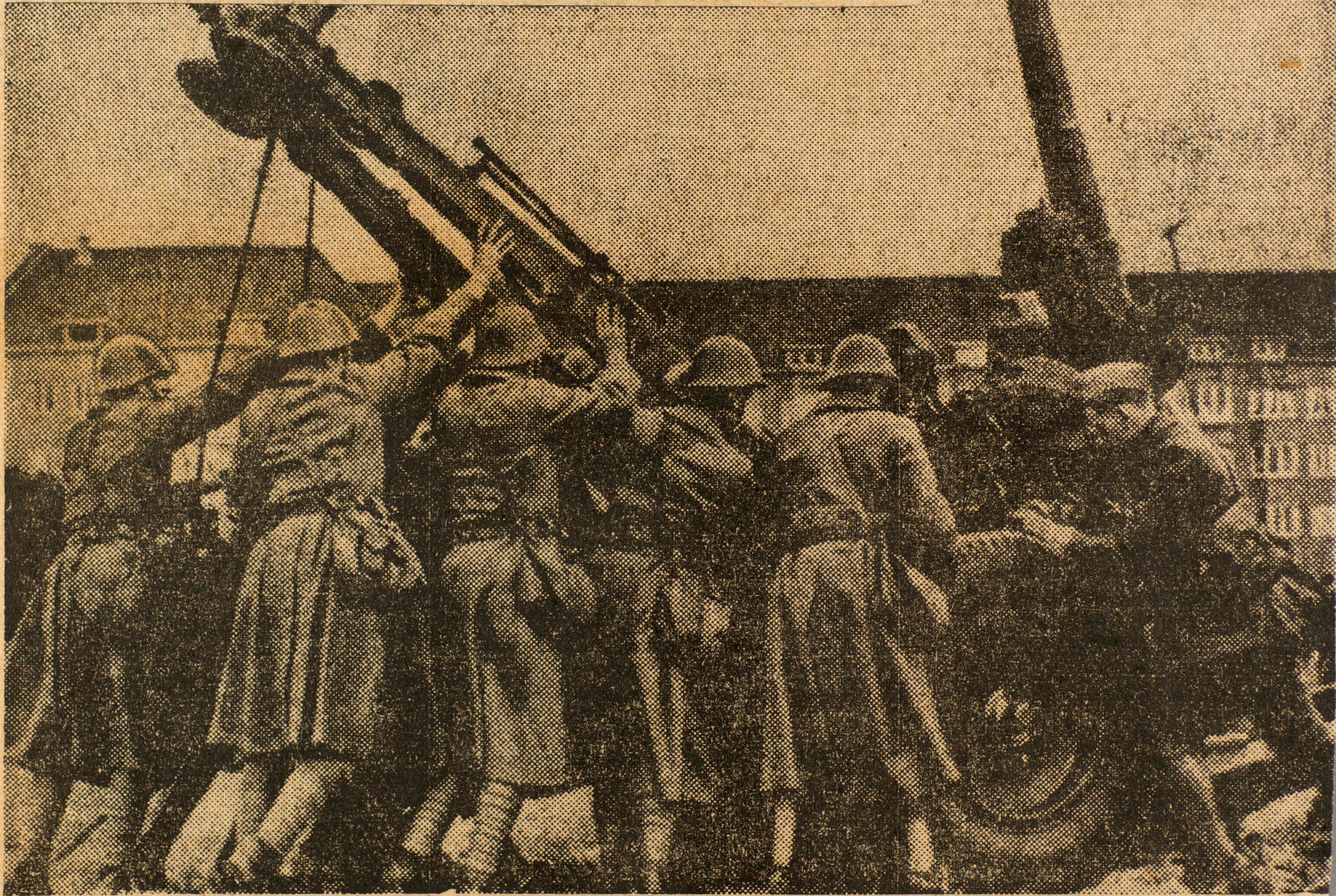


# Dutch Prepare as Nazis Threaten Invasion

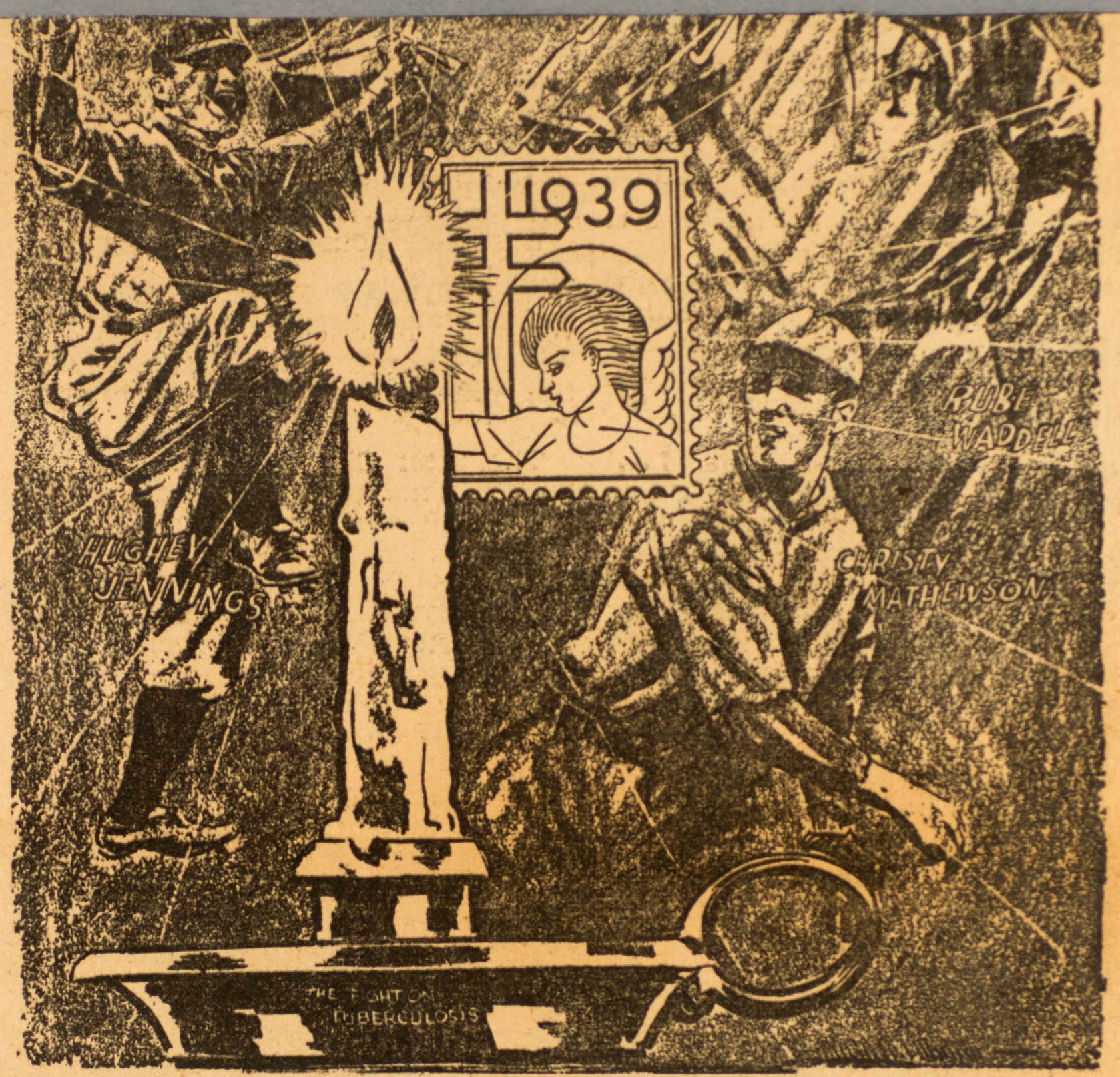
**TALKS ARE RESUMED**

HONGKONG: Chiang Kai-shek reportedly is holding nightly conferences at his official residence with T. V. Soong, Dr. H.H. Kung and C. T. Wang for re-examination of the British, American, French and Soviet attitudes toward China. The Chungking leaders, it is said, are redrafting China's foreign policy on the basis of Foreign Minister Wang Chung-hui's conversations with British Ambassador Sir Archibald Clark Kerr and American Ambassador Nelson T. Johnson, Kung's talks with Soviet Ambassador Alexander Panouckine and the reports from Ambassador Quo Tai-chang in London, Ambassador Dr. Hu Shih in Washington, Ambassador Wellington Koo in Paris and Ambassador Ho Yueh-tsu in Moscow.

# Royal School to Celebrate 100th Anniversary in 1940

Second oldest existing school in the territory, Royal school of Honolulu will celebrate the 100th anniversary of its founding next year.

Established in 1840, it was called "Royal" because the object of the school at that time was to educate the young native chiefs who would at some time be likely to rule the islands or be prominent in the advancement of Hawaii Nei.
