A "gentlemen's agreement" for the delivery of 3,000 warplanes, worth £44,000,000, is said to have been already made between representatives of the British and French governments and Americans.

Aside from the foregoing, the French government is said to be expected shortly to establish a branch aircraft factory in the United States at an expenditure of £4,000,000.

It was learned today that the conference at Paris last Friday between Winston Churchill, British first lord of the admiralty, and French Premier Edouard Daladier had discussed plans for large scale purchase of warplanes and supplies from the United States.

It was reported that the training planes ordered from the Lockheed Aircraft corporation by Britain and the battle planes ordered from the Curtis firm by the French government are expected to be delivered shortly.
