
THE SCHWABENLAND CATAPULTS THE NORDMEER



In Long Island Sound, off Larchmont, the German mother ship "Schwabenland" shot the Deutsche Lufthansa flyingboat "Nordmeer" into the air on her return flight to the Azores. Shortly before the "Nordwind" had arrived, completing her first westward flight.
