

Kazuhisa Abe Is New Magistrate On Big Island

Appointment of Kazuhisa Abe, Hilo attorney, as district magistrate for North and South Kohala, Hawaii, has been announced by Judge James L. Coke, chief justice of the supreme court of Hawaii.

The new district judge who will handle work of the courts at North Kohala and at Waimea, South Kohala, will fill the position left vacant by the recent resignation of Henry Van Gieson.

Judge Abe was graduated from the law school of Michigan univer-

sity in February, 1939, after two and a half years of study there. Before going to the mainland he was graduated from Hilo high school and the University of Hawaii.

The new Hawaii judge has been practicing in Hilo since he was admitted to the territorial bar last fall.

Judge Abe is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Manshiro Abe of Pepekeo, Hawaii.

Since Van Gieson's resignation, Judge Manuel S. Botelho of the Hamakua district court, had been serving in the Kohala courts temporarily.

Judge Botelho has been reappointed for another two-year term by Chief Justice Coke. The Hamakua magistrate has served from September 6, 1927.

Three district magistrates on Maui were also reappointed. They are Judge Andrew S. Wong at Wailuku, Judge Smith J. Kaiama at Lahaina and Judge Young Wa at Ha-
