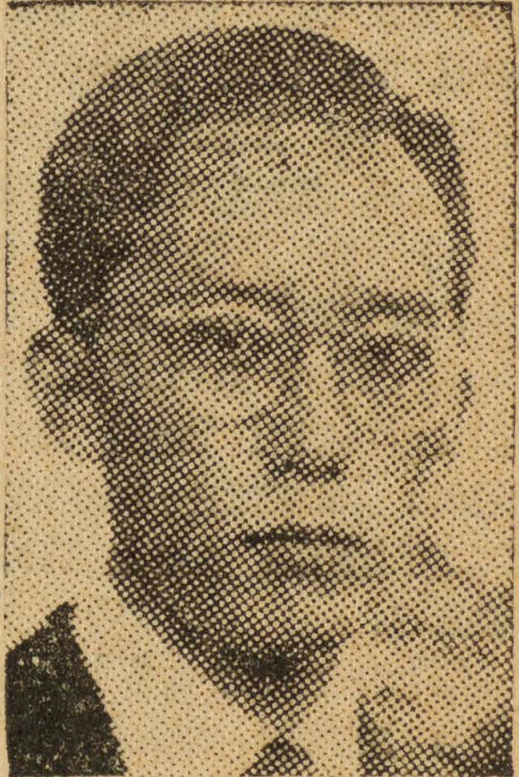


Stephen Araki Gets N. D. Scholarship
