Knowledge of the language of the country sufficient to carry on the proposed study is one of the eligibility requirements. He is the author in Japanese of a biography of Father William Joseph Chaminade, Marianist founder, published in 1950. Brother Augustine was graduated from St. Louis college in 1945. At the University of Dayton he majored in mathematics and science. Upon completing his studies in 1949, he returned to Hawaii to teach at St. Joseph high school in Hilo. Now at his alma mater, he is homeroom teacher of a senior class and moderator of the swimming team.

Awards under the Fulbright Act are a part of the educational exchange program of the state department.

The objectives of this program are to promote a better understanding of the United States abroad, and to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and those of other countries.

The government grant covers tuition, books and fees, maintenance, and transportation.
