

Dr. Thomas Fujiwara Opens His Office on Vineyard St. Today

Dr. Thomas Fukuo Fujiwara, son of Mr. and Mrs. Shuji Fujiwara, owners of the Shunchoro teahouse, Alewa Heights, and who returned here in August after completing nine years of medical studies on the mainland, today opened his office for the practice of medicine at 22 S. Vineyard street.

Office hours will be from 9 a.m. to noon and 2 to 4 p.m. on week days, from 7 to 8 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and from 9 a.m. to noon on holidays and Sundays.

Dr. Fujiwara received his M.D. degree from Tulane university, New Orleans, in 1936, and received a two-year fellowship in pathology at the Lakeside hospital of the Western Reserve university in Cleveland, O., passing his national medical board examinations in 1938.

After spending another year with the Cleveland City hospital, he became connected with the Pratt Diagnostic hospital and the New England Medical Center, both of Boston, during the next two years, serving as instructor in medicine at Tufts Medical school at the same time.

He was graduated second in his class at Tulane, and was admitted into Alpha Omega Alpha, national medical honorary fraternity.

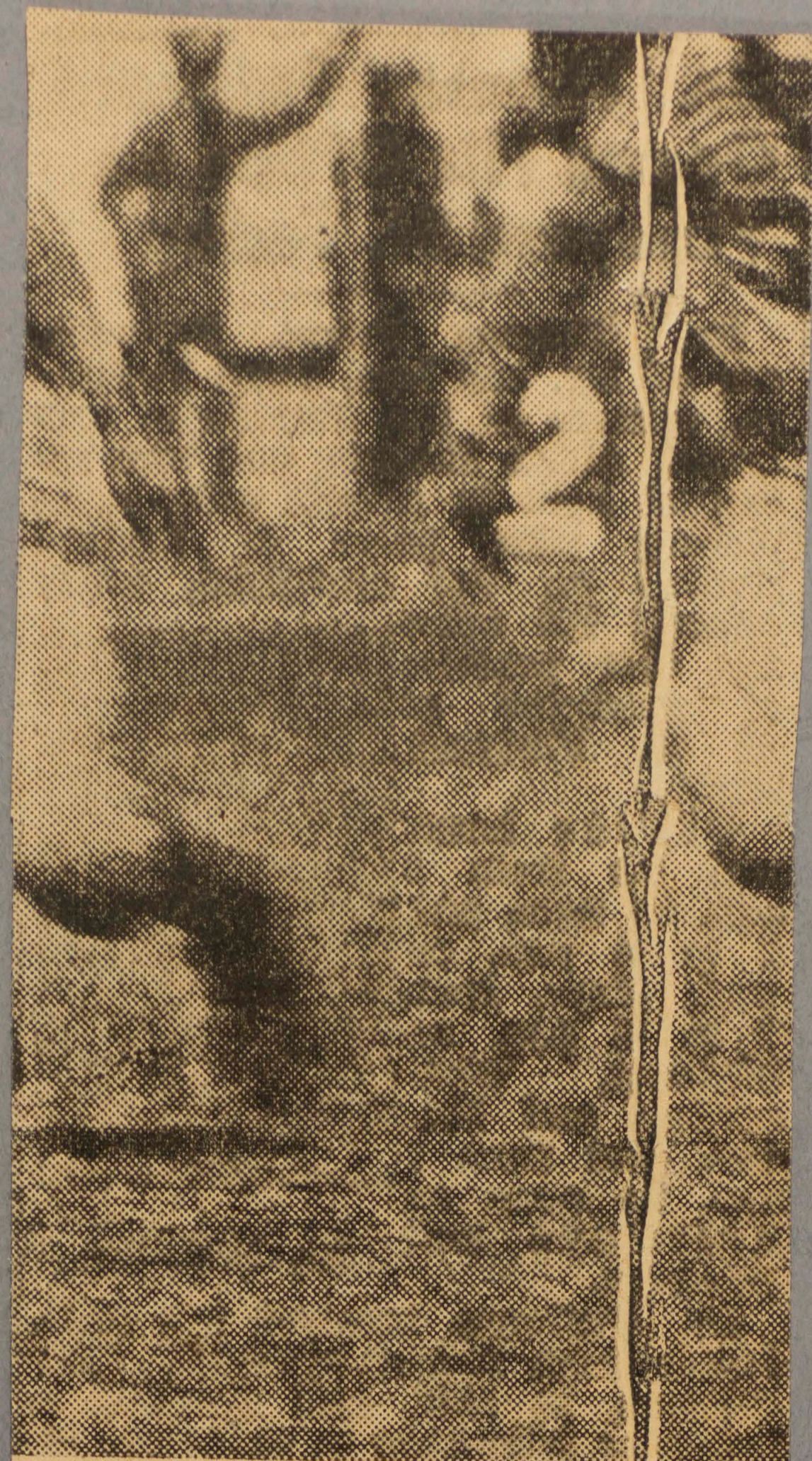
Dr. Fujiwara was graduated from McKinley high school in 1929, and attended the University of Hawaii for three years before leaving for Tulane university in 1932.

Over 250 persons were invited to meet Dr. and Mrs. Fujiwara at a dinner given Wednesday night at the Shunchoro teahouse.
