and Wade Dean and Mack have been
out all day. Mack wants to sell his
Timber while it is so high wish you
Boys could drop some of yours.
Wish you could sell yours.
but don't suppose that could be.
do you know if there is anything
in the war may stop at anytime
but there could not be anything so
good could happen. I don't believe
it nothing so good could happen
to us all. but if there could
be wouldn't it be great.
I am so homesick to see you all.
and to get up home once more
I think we all would be glad to get
home. The weather has been fine
no rain as yet. The timber looks
so nice all colored up so pretty.
I haven't seen anyone from up

home in a long time every one are
so busy while the weather is fine.
I am fairly good do not get out any
where. I have never even been up
to Ethel's do not feel like walking
much. Vickie is just fairly well
you know us two Old gals arent
so Taxy as we were 50 years ago.
I am so sorry for you poor kids
so far away from home. as you are,
every thing you buy costs so much
Vickie got a sack of Potatoes the other
day Paid \$3⁵⁰ They weren't 1st class or
she would have Paid \$4.⁰⁰ and they
say they will be higher yet. Ethel
is good to get my mail. Victoria and
Harry came home last night she dont
get home every weekend she is
doing fine. at her work she worked
overtime last ^{week} and earned \$^{6.00} extra
she is going to make a good storage.
have you got the 5⁰⁰ I sent you last
week. how are the Boys standing their
work hope you can get in a house
before it gets too cold, well I will wish
you all good by and write when you can
with lots of love to you all. and hope
we meet again before too long Grandma
