Our train arrived in
Hood River at 7:15 a.m.
just two hours late.
Louis phoned Al from
there but he had
left for the woods.
and we couldn't get

Sid Miller either, by phone, so we walked across the bridge. Some man who lids boxes at the Star gave us a ride from the bridge to the Star, then we walked to the little mill at White Salmon and waited there for Al to come in with his load of logs. we were both quite sleepy and tired, we didn't sleep much on the train, but we really enjoyed the nice

things you gave us for lunch, because the train was so crowded people had to stand in line for over an hour to get to the dining car. so we had it over on most of them because we had such a nice lunch. and you will never guess how much we appreciated it.

After we got home and seen how well Glenn had taken

care of things we were sorry we had not stayed a day longer at least, we hope to be able to make the trip again some time

We finally got a rain, but too late to be of any help, the wind was terrible all night, our toilet blew over, and the barn door came open and blew off, one of the cows went in and was eating rolled barley out

of the sack, I don't think she had been eating long because she didn't eat much we hope she won't be sick over it.

Louis wanted me to ask if George would care to sell his drag saw? Al had some work done on it, but they have been unable to make it run. and Louis thought he might be able to repair it himself. he said he would

talk to Al, but he wanted to ask George too.

I guess I had better stop now, this writing looks more like hen scratching, but I hope you wont mind to much because it hurts so to hold the pen.
