If I was George I would fix that Chev truck up a little and sell it again if he cant sell it up there I can down here if he dont want it any more he wont get any thing for it after the war.

and speaking of the war I still think Germany will be out of the war by the end of winter they wont surrender uncondittionally but they will let the English and Americans in from the British Islands and Italy and keep on fighting on the Russian front untill the english and Americans get in. and it is close at hand. now too.

Then we will just have the Japanese front to look after.

I hope to come up before long if I can get things fixed up here a little before I go but I cant do any thing very much now

Well Kay I am trying to finish your letter now am some better to day but am weak done a washing today, well they moved Mrs Pyatt to a hospital at North Bonnerville or Old Folks home or some thing of the kind I dont know who done it yet.
