HOME CANNING

When application for sugar to be used for home canning is submitted, the following additional information is required.

AMOUNT OF SUGAR ALLOWED FOR HOME CANNING

One pound of sugar may be allowed per four quarts of finished canned **fruit**.

The following **estimates** may be used as basis in determining the **approximate** number of quarts of finished product obtainable from a stated amount of raw fruit.

Fruit	Unit of Measure	Approximate Canning Yield in Quarts per Unit of Measure
Apples	(48 lbs. to bushel)	20
Peaches	(48 lbs. to bushel)	20
Pears	(50 lbs. to bushel)	24
Plums	(56 lbs. to bushel)	28
Apricots	(48 lbs. to bushel)	18
Grapes (for juice)	(48 lbs. to bushel)	18
Cherries	(32 quarts to bushel)	20
Blackberries	(24 quart crate)	16
Red Raspberries	(24 quart crate)	15
Black Raspberries	(24 quart crate)	16
Strawberries	(24 quart crate)	12

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One pound of sugar is allowed per person per year for use in preparing preserves, jams, jellies, or fruit butters.
