Dearest Kei: - Received your letter of Aug. 27, this morning. Thanks for your suggestions for our trip on the train, you surely think of everything for us, don't you? We all appreciate your thoughtfulness. Children read your letter over and over again and said, "we will wait for daddy in Idaho, or wait till the war is over, but will not go to Japan." Over one thousand people left for Wyoming in last two days, + there many empty rooms, but so much noise again, sawing, ~~happ~~ hammering, babies cry and radios going in full blast, Oh, it's terrible! Some one here had an Idaho newspaper on which I saw most of the pictures of our new ~~town~~ home near "Eden," which is, by no means as same as that of what we read in the Bible, miles and miles of dusty plains dotted with sage brush, it surely does not look like our Oregon, our home sweet home. But we must keep our chin up! Some day we'll be mighty glad and proud that we've done our bit in this great Peace-making Task.
