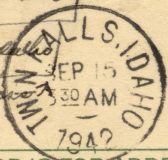

Dearest Kei! - Your card dated Sept. 3, forwarded, received Sept. 10.

All the professionals from the Portland center were sent to Wyoming, except Dr. Shiomu, who is here now, he always seemed to have some way of beating out the way he does not want a part of big shot? Many things I wish to tell you but better not go into details. Families of Dr. Nakata, Dr. Kayama, Dr. Oyama and M. Namba had to go to Wyoming, separated from the Portland friends and they were almost heart-broken. Namba were so very good to our family ever since you were gone. Wm. says Alfred was his best friend and is sad because he feels that this will be a long separation. About two days before we had a terrible dust storm and had to close windows to stay in, but its better today. We saw a rattle snake (billed) about a yard long with 8 rattles! I am afraid to go very far away from our barracks. Some of the rooms in block 35 so not have lights fixed yet, & we had to sleep in dark for 4 nights already. Our meals are getting better. Mr. Sakigawa is now chief cook but he is not strong. I'm now helping in the dining room but its too hard for me, one from each family has to help. T. Habita's family is the only ones I know well in our block 35 all the rest are those restaurants & hotel people & I don't know them so well.
