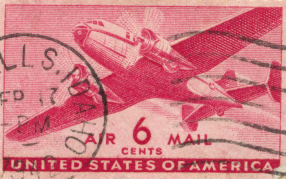

Dearest Kii; - About an hour ago Hito Okada came to see us. Gave me \$50⁰⁰ from you. Thanks a lot! I was at the end of the rope, but this money will do for long times. We get food and lodging but have to buy everything else from the canteen, and there will be no more free coupons for us. I am so glad to know you are well and be able to work. Your health was my worries all the times because of the hot climate of Ga. Now this dusty air is getting the best of me, - I do ^{not} feel well, my chest is heavy. We want you to join us, but not here, it's too dusty, you'll be sick too.

I was so happy to see Mr. Okada, and I can't write any more. Went to Satas and told them all about what I heard from Hito.
