Dearst Kii: - This one was supposed be written four days ago on the Palm Sunday but always something come up and I could not sit down to write. This week was so very busy, besides working in the mess hall, I had to work on Eva's Easter shirt and a blouse for which she was asking for a long time. No one is getting Easter cloth but Eva.

William now is waiting for his pay so he can get a pair of shoes. We all have holes in our shoes but the shoe-repair in the center is so busy that we have to get a ration card from our block manager to get shoes fixed, it is terrible.

Your letter of April 8, and a card for Eva of April 9 came two days ago, also your package with some candy and salt peanuts, Willie feels that you should keep the candy.

I am so glad to hear Satao sent you some salt palm, it is very expensive here and we cannot buy. I do wish to send you something but you know our financial condition.

Yesterday at the legal aid office of WRA we have completed the statement of my appeal for your rehearing. We'll be hearing from the Oregon U. S. Attorney of yes or no of the chance you might have for your rehearing. Don't count on it too much but leave all to God's hand. I have done this to satisfy children's request. Will let you know when I hear from Portland which may not be next very soon.

This letter is not very long but you'll excuse me for it is getting late and although tomorrow is my day off, must go to the hospital to get my teeth fixed and get Kijo's glasses, too bad she has wear glasses. It is so hard to get appointments with doctors and dentists, but I believe it is just as bad outside with Caucasian people too, shortage of doctors & dentists.

How's Mr. Ikuya feeling by now? Mrs. Ikuya is so much worried because she has handfull with her daughter being operated on her appendix, but she is getting along just fine. I am writing this short letter so you'll not worry over us. We are all well now. Love, Teru over
