Dearest Kei, Last night as we came home from Twin Falls, your good letter from Santa Fe was waiting for me and was made happy although quite tired.

I am glad we do not have to go to town again for it gets us so very tired.

When we went out for the first time, all we had to do was to shop for other people & got too tired, came home sick, but this time we never told any one, so we shopped for us alone and saw a very good movie, "Cabin in the Sky", all negro cast. It was so good that we do not have to see another movie for the next one year; it had everything, love, romance, song, dance, tears and laughter. I surely thought of you much & so hard.

Do you still remember the last movie you, Willie & Eva saw together in Portland about two years ago, "One Foot in Heaven" and "The New Wine"? At that time Keigo and I were not feeling well & stayed home, do you remember?

children talk about it so much and
oh, how our hearts ache for you.

It costed us \$42⁰⁰ to get
glasses for Eva & me, they will
be ready in a week or so, and we
had to get them outside instead of
through WRA which takes about two
to three months and Eva's eyes are
so bad now. \$15⁰⁰ for exam-
ination for both of us, and the
lenses costed 50¢ cheaper than in
Portland ^{\$27⁰⁰ for two pairs} People in Idaho are good
to us evacuees. We went to Am.
restaurant & had chicken dinner & was
so very good, but we've not have
that for a long time again.

Bought some dry goods for our
summer dresses, I've to make them
myself & will be busy the next
few weeks.

We write more about our trip
to town when I have more
time. We're very grateful for the better mail
service.
