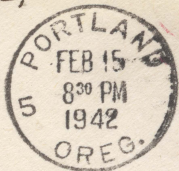


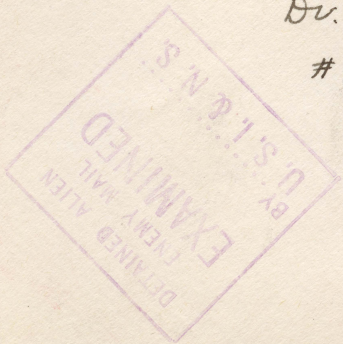

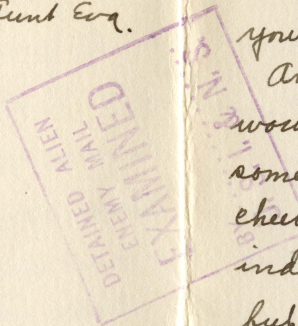

things. I have learned from

No one knows better than we do the struggle you have had, the many disappointments, and almost unmountable obstacles which you have overcome, and we know the Lord will help you now, in this the hardest situation of all.
