BY NORIKO TAKAHASHI Minneapolis Kaoru Umetani, a former rear admiral in the Japanese Navy, has been in Minneapolis for two and a half years now. From his amiable round face and small figure, no one can sense that he was once a group captain in the Japanese Navy during World War II.

Most Risky Moment "The most risky moment in my life was," Umetani said, "when we were flying to Katherine Island from Saipan." He continued, "It was the birthday of Franklin Roosevelt. We expected that the U.S. Air Force would attack us in commemoration of Roosevelt's birthday, so we postponed our departure for one day. What happened next?" He recalled, "We were bombed completely for two weeks from the day after Roosevelt's birthday! Captain Umetani and his corps had a narrow escape during the night."

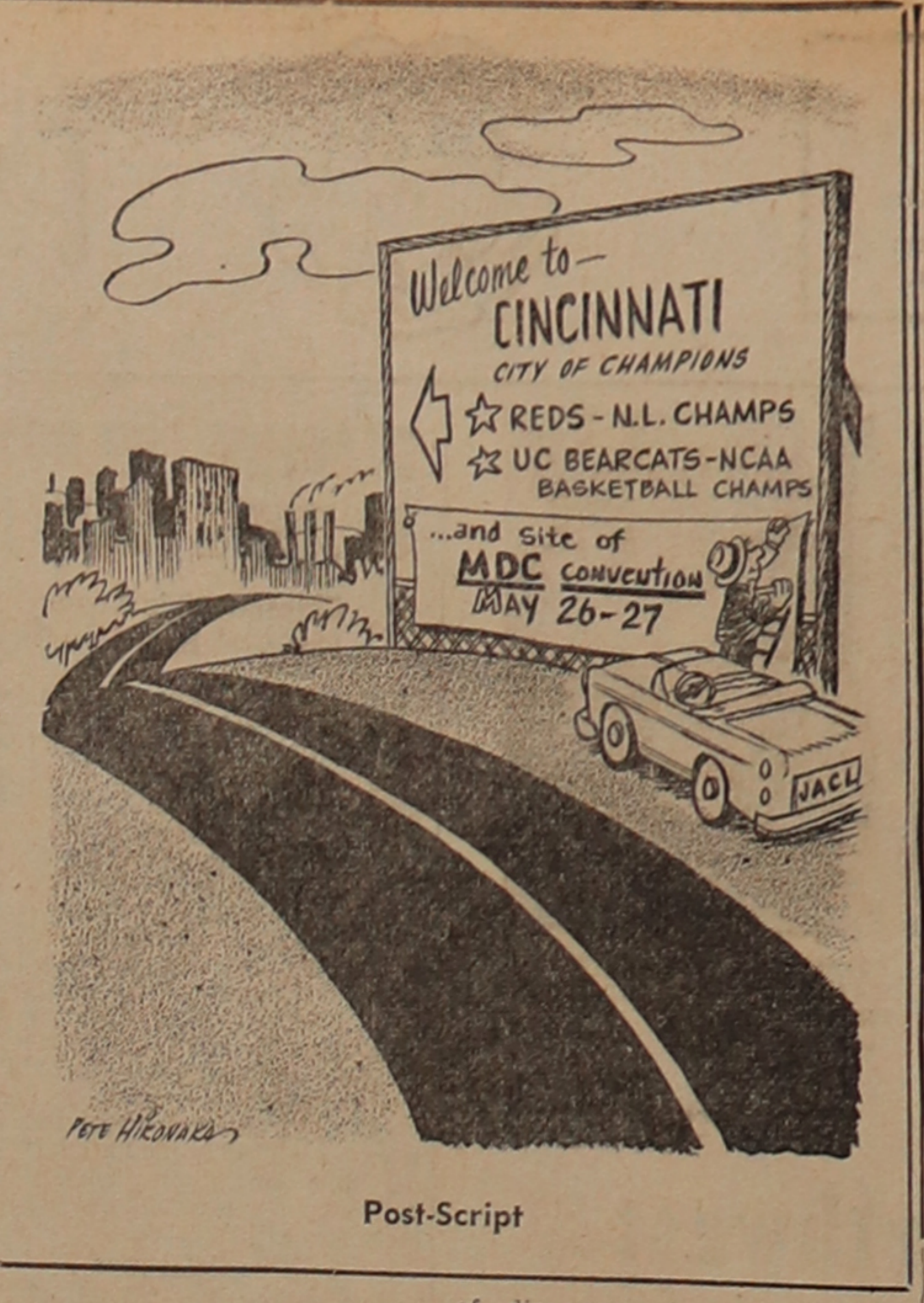
