### Vote Due in September

The change will be submitted to the lodges in September and the vote should be completed by October. Yothers said it was "highly unlikely" the decision would be ratified. He attributed the decision to the recent U.S. Supreme Court refusal to rule on a Maine law permitting revocation of food and liquor licenses of private organizations that discriminate in restricting membership.



Matsumura said his booksize, several-pound invention, called an hepatic support device, is designed to be used outside the body, like an artificial kidney, processing blood from a patient and returning the treated blood.

Matsumura said he has put in nearly 10 years of research for the device. He has been granted a patent on it, clearing the way for clinical trials,






