six-week stay were spent in traveling to Hakone and visiting the horse races. The culmination of his visit came on Aug. 25 when the Grant party attended a popular festival in Ueno Park and planted trees there.

Before leaving for home on Sept. 3 on the ship, "City of New York," the Grant paid a visit at the Imperial Palace on Aug. 30, for which Grant uncharacteristically prepared a statement, which expressed his gratitude and predicted that "someday Japan would do great things."

Fr. Tegeder listed the main effects of Grant's visit as being: (1) Grant's policy toward the Far East was made evident, namely that America should respect the sovereignty of China and Japan. His stance was advanced in that he stated that America merely had a commercial interest in Japan.

(2) He emphasized building a bridge between East and West. (Ed. Note—Grant returned with a young Japanese "schoolboy" whose picture can be seen in a photo taken when the ex-President visited Virginia City, Nev. The story is that the Japanese stayed at the Grant home in Mt. McGregor, N.Y., till after Grant died in 1885.)

Malheur's 'Top Op' Farmer

ONTARIO, Ore.—Pride in what you are doing, be interested in what you are doing, enjoy what you are doing, are "trademarks" of Kay Teramura and his efforts as one of Malheur County's Top Op Farmers this year.

His friends told Malheur County Extension Agent Ray Novotny recently that Teramura is dedicated to excellence in everything he does.

A Snake River 100 Club member, Teramura came here in 1943. He and his wife, Dorothy, have three children, all Oregon State graduates: Kenneth, agricultural engineer, and a farming partner; Dinah, with Oregon Regional Primate Center; and Gayle, with Univ. of Oregon Medical Center.

The Teramura farming operation made up of three groups, consists of 400 acres in onions, sugar beets, potatoes, alfalfa and grain. He leans heavily on the Malheur Experiment Station and the County Extension Office for new ideas and technology in farming.

To avoid the economic problems that farmers face, the Top Op farmer said they must work together through their various commodity groups and organizations.

He serves as president of the Malheur Onion Growers Assn., a trustee of the National Onion Assn., and is active with the Malheur Potato Grower Assn., North Board of Control Irrigation, Buddhist Church of Ontario and the local JACL, to name a few.

Since land values continue to rise, he feels one must raise crops that are expected to make the greatest returns.

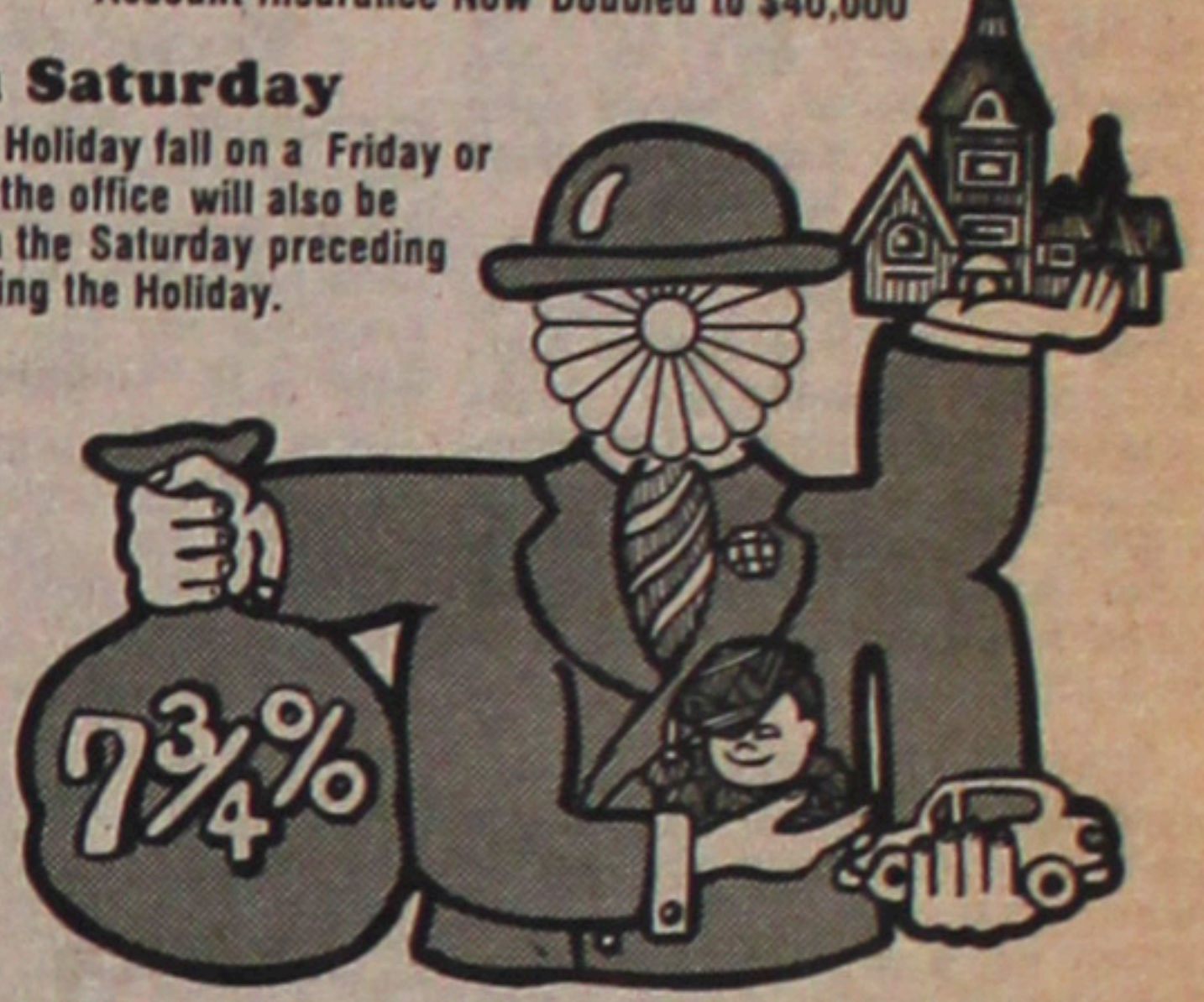

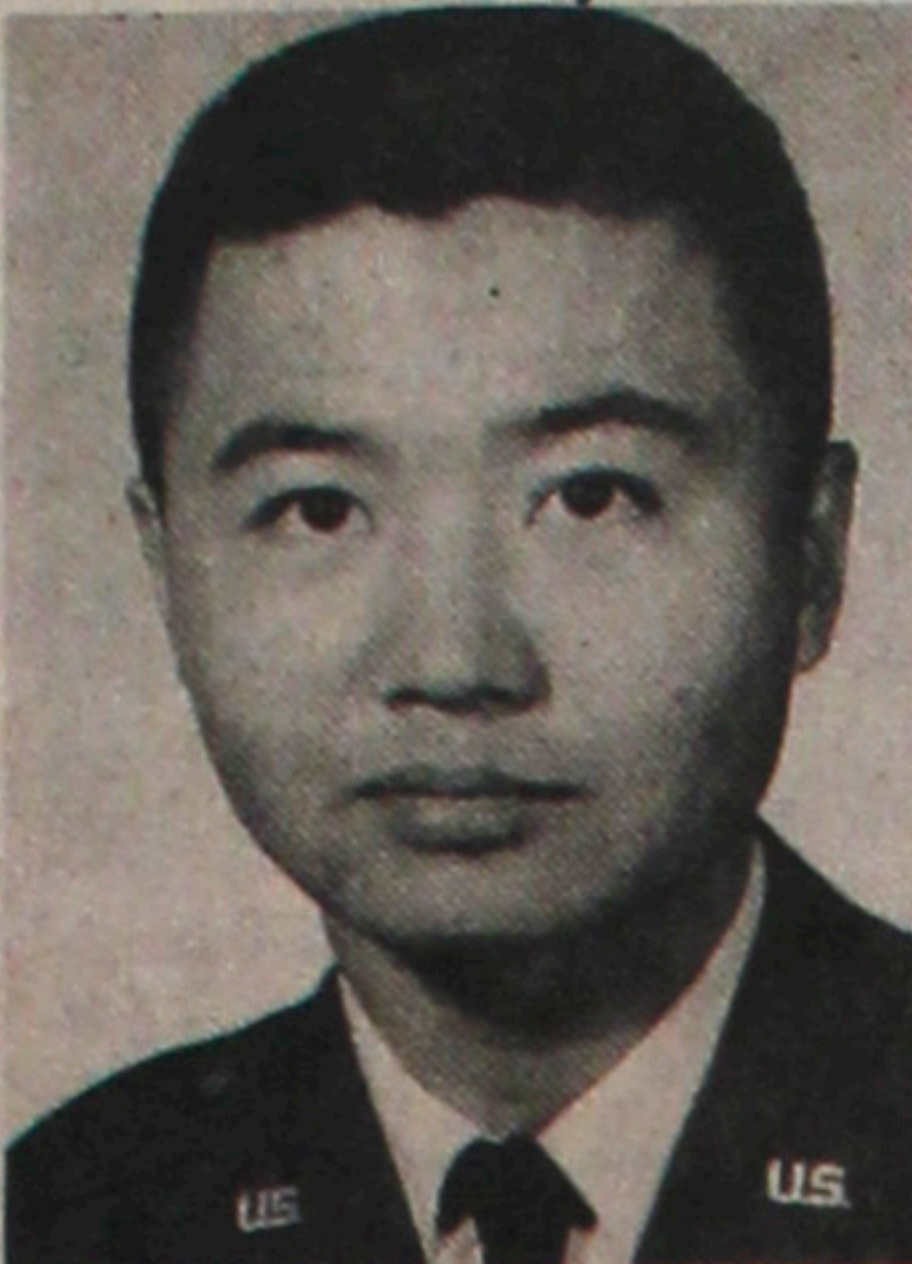
