Dear Sir:

I am writing to you in behalf of my husband, Yoshito Fujii, who was interned on January 20th, and is at present detained at the United States Immigration. I would like very much to ask your aid in obtaining a possible release.

Last year, he had a serious accident which required several blood transfusions, and he is still under Dr. Nelson's care. Soon after his accident, I became very ill, and was ordered to bed from March to Dedember. I am still weak, and with three small children on my hands, I can never carry on our bottling business, try as I may, and it is absolutely necessary that my husband do the work. We have no money to hire extra help for it all went to doctor's fee.

I realize that this is wartime, and that no personal graivances are to be considered, but when there four lives at stake, I cannot help but appeal to you for a release. If there should be any evidences against him, I have nothing more to say.

We have tried all our lives to be loyal American citizens to America-being educated and married in America, and bringing up our children according to highest American ideals. My husband has even relinquished his inheritance of his father's estate in Japan and has chosen to live here. What more can one ask of an Alien?

For these reasons, I am asking you r kindest cooperation in releasing him, or if this is impossible, at least parolling him. I swear and guarantee that he will neither hide nor escape—that is out of the question.

I appeal to you, and I beg of you to give this matter your kindest consideration.
