George Asumano was elected to represent the Northwest District at the National Convention in San Francisco. William Y. Mimbu was nominated 2nd. Vice President of the National JACL. A credit union and insurance program under auspices of the JACL was introduced. Mas Satow explained the procedure for nominating "The Nisei of the Bicentennial", discussed the need for a planned program to help aging Issei, the tentative program of the National Convention, plans for removing the Alien Land Laws from the statutes and status of the Evacuation Claims. Dr. Kelly Yamada is the Chairman of the N.W. District Council.

PRESIDENT JIM MATSUCKA received word this week from Senators Jackson & Magnuson that they would support the Lane-Hillings Bill. This is the one to provide compensation for all of us who were evacuated during the war.
