## The National JACL Legacy Fund

Support for the Legacy Fund as of December 13, 1990 totalled \$708,188.67, according to Clay Harada, National Legacy Fund Administrator. This is a great start toward the \$10 million goal.

Of the December 13th total, Northwest contributors sent in checks or pledges in the amount of \$92,670, representing 13% of the total. Included in this amount and credited to the Seattle Chapter was \$55,700 or 7.9% of the national total.

Remember there will be an annual distribution of earnings from the Legacy Fund. Distribution will be:

- 20% to Chapters in proportion to their credits.
- 10% to a pool which will fund chapter programs best meeting the National Program for Action Goals, as adopted at the 1990 National JACL Convention.
- 5% retained in the Fund for growth, and
- 65% retained by National JACL to meet annual budget needs, currently \$1.1 million.

I urge every JACL member to support the Legacy Fund. We need this fund to assure the financial health and ability of the Chapter/National JACL team to pursue its mission into the future. As an example, the Redress effort could not have succeeded without this teamwork. I urge your participation in a program that will help generations to come, much as our Issei parents and grandparents did for us.

Financial Planning


April 30: Financial Security II: Source of Income, Social Security, and Medi-




#### Commission on Asian American Affairs' Directory
