### DON'T CONFUSE ME WITH FACTS, MY MIND'S MADE UP

Gordon W. Alport, professor of psychology, Harvard University, once defined ethnic prejudice as an antipathy based upon a faulty and inflexible generalization that may be felt or expressed, and directed toward a group as a whole or toward an individual because he is a member of that group.

In Alport's book Nature of Prejudice, he states that a common corollary of the attitude of prejudice is ethnocentrism--the attitude where one looks with favor upon the ways of his own group and judges other groups by the values of his own. The familiar ways of his own group are believed to be the natural and right and superior ways to the less familiar ones of other groups.

The most serious aspect of prejudice is its effect on those toward whom it is directed. It is often expressed in discrimination -- in segregation -- in physical attacks against person and property-in jokes and name calling and develops precisely those qualities of behavior that the dominant group dislikes such as hypersensitivity and chip on the shoulder attitudes.

The resulting attitudes developed by those to whom prejudice has been directed are expressed in distinct kinds of personality patterns. These include the lowering of aspiration and motivation as protection against further frustrations; a flashy display of jewels, clothes and cars, that is symbolic of status; clowning; and aggression, sometimes physical-especially among the lower social economic class-toward the dominant group, other minorities, and one's own group.

According to Alport, these personality patterns may be formed as early as by six or seven years of age.




